Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.


#### II Corinthians 10:3-5

#### Shame's Arguments:

You're a hypocrite.

#### Tearing Down Shame's Arguments



Nothing—not even Satan's schemes—can separate me from God's love for me (Romans 8:38-39).

There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. (Romans 8:1)

God rescued me and brought me from darkness to light. He redeemed me and has forgiven me completely (Colossians 1:13-14).

God has removed my sin as far as the east is from the west (Psalm 103: 12).

#### **Pride's Arguments:**

It's wrong to put God to the test, or demand a "sign". (Matthew 4:7, 8:11)

God is for the humble and against the proud. (James 4:7)

Submitting to God is part of resisting the devil. (James 4:7)

I must get rid of bitterness and anger, and be kind and compassionate to others. (Ephesians 4:31-32)

#### Temptations's Arguments:

It's hopeless. I'll never have victory.

This isn't that big of a deal. The risk is minimal.

Technically, this isn't wrong. Not if you look at the whole picture.

No one will ever know. No one can see.

I'm the exception. I'm special.
